POSITION SUMMARY:

The incumbent will be a member of the Equity Movement student team under the direction of the Assistant Manager, Co-curricular Diversity & Equity. They will assist in the outreach to underserved student groups on campus, develop and strengthen partnerships, and assist with the promotions of equity initiatives and programs through social media. They will also assist in the evaluation of programs, with a primary focus on event evaluations design, distribution and summary. The successful applicant will assist with outreach, promotions and provide on-site coordination for equity initiatives which may include events related to accessibility, mental health, cultural awareness, faith, positive space and gender related programs, plus other duties as assigned, to advance the Faculty of Kinesiology & Physical Education's goals to provide inclusive and accessible physical education programs for students, staff and faculty. A mid-term and final report with highlights, challenges, and recommendations will be due, along with a final report at the end of the contract period.
