POSITION SUMMARY:

The incumbent will be a member of the Equity Movement student team under the direction of the Assistant Manager, Co-curricular Diversity & Equity. They will assist in the development, implementation, and evaluation of a retreat in the fall, and equity education events and trainings over the year. During the retreat, trainings and education programs, the incumbent will lead or co-lead physical activities, and assist with the facilitation of equity related workshops. The retreat, trainings and events will support leadership development and capacity building, to advance the Faculty of Kinesiology & Physical Education's goals to provide inclusive and accessible physical education outreach programs for students, staff and faculty. The successful applicant will also liaise with student networks and assist with recruitment of participants for these programs. They will also assist with additional equity initiatives that may include accessibility, positive space and gender related programs, plus other duties as assigned. A report with highlights, challenges, and recommendations will be submitted within two weeks of the retreat and training/education programs, and prior to the end of the contract.
