Summary:	Camp Coordinators are an essential part of the supervisory team for Camp U of T. The Coordinator – aquatics is responsible for planning and implementing staff training around recreational swim times; liaising with aquatic staff around scheduling, setups, ensuring that all OCA and U of T aquatics standards are followed regarding supervision and ratios of campers and tracking swim assessment results. Coordinators also maintain, inventory and order equipment and supplies, including all first aid equipment. Coordinators may be asked to mediate disputes and find solutions with campers, parents and staff. Energy, teamwork, problem solving and communication are all essential to the job. Applicants must be dedicated to providing a great camp experience for all campers and staff. The Coordinator, aquatics will work as a team to support all campers, staff and programs.

Experience supervising staff is strongly encouraged. Candidates must be able to work well independently as well as part of a supervisory team.
