Instructors are expected to act in a manner that is representative of both KPE and the assigned governing body. All course pre-requisites must be verified before the start of the class. Core plans/course outlines and daily lesson plans must be created and shared with management staff prior to the start of the course. Instructors are responsible for continuously evaluating and documenting participants' performance and providing timely verbal and written feedback to candidates regarding their participation and ability to meet the communicated course standards. Attendance must be recorded; certification courses require 100% participatory attendance. Test sheets and certification cards are to be completed by the end of the course.
