Summary:	Reporting to the Manager, Tri-Campus Sport and supervised by the Coordinators, Tri-Campus Sport Operations & Administration, as well as the Head Therapist for day-to-day operational tasks, the incumbent will be the first aid responder for Intramurals games and/or an athletic therapist for Tri-Campus events. They are responsible for knowing and understanding emergency procedures and risk management principles that are relevant to the Intramural program.
Minimum Qualifications:	<p>Education: Minimum of two years post-secondary education completed. Preference will be given to those with experience in course-based, athletic therapy fieldwork. Education in Kinesiology or health related field is an asset.</p> <p>Certifications: Standard First Aid/ CPR-C certificate no more than 3 years prior to application date & Basic Rescuer/Level C CPR certificate no more than 1 year prior to application date, issued from Red Cross or Lifesaving Society or St. John's Ambulance.</p> <p>Experience: One-year minimum experience working in an athletic therapy setting working directly on-field with athletes. Can be accumulated through course-based fieldwork/placement, volunteer work, or paid work. Please include references on resume that can attest to this experience.</p>

	<p>Skills: This position requires the ability to provide first-aid treatment in a fast-paced sporting environment, and to administer the proper care depending on the needs of the individual. Different scenarios may present itself that requires you to adapt your treatment approach, requiring excellent problem-solving skills. The goal is to provide first aid and assist in injury mediation, not diagnosing an injury. It is your responsibility to direct students to further care if their issue requires further medical attention (ex. MacIntosh Clinic, hospital, etc.). Other: Must provide a valid Social Insurance Number (SIN).</p> <p>Interviews will be scheduled as candidates are identified. It is the candidate's responsibility to be available for potential interview times that will be posted.</p> <p>Note: A Mandatory Training session is required, schedule TBD.</p> <p>*Note – Preference will be given to University of Toronto Students in the hiring process.</p>
