Administrative duties include filling out reports for situations. Responsible for set up and take down of activities that are lifeguarded. Responsible for maintaining excellent communication with fellow staff members, supervisors and managers including preventive maintenance of the facility, and potential problems. Other duties may also be assigned such as pool maintenance tasks.
