Summary:	<p>The Overnight Supervisor is responsible for ensuring the general safety, security, and comfort of youth participants during their overnight stay in the hotel throughout the SOAR program. Overnight Supervisors will be expected to stay at the hotel and respond to issues or emergencies overnight between the hours of 9pm – 2am or 2am – 7am. They will serve as respectful, welcoming, and positive role models for youth, support youth, and follow through on commitments to the program.</p> <p>We are looking for responsible and reliable students, who work well with youth/teens and who are completely committed to providing a positive and safe overnight environment for participants.</p> <p>Duties include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The direct supervision and guidance of a group of 20 teens during their overnight stay at the hotel. • Act as the primary point of contact for youth during your shift to assist with questions, concerns, or any mental/physical health matters • Provide positive support to participants • Contact the appropriate resources in the case of an emergency • Communicate with manager and coordinators during and after your shift as needed. • Report program successes and suggest enhancements at the end of the program.
Minimum Qualifications:	<p>Education: Current UofT Student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must be available on-call during their shift (8pm – 1:30am or 1:30am – 7 am). • Effective time management and organizational skills. • Demonstrated team work ability. • Knowledge of and interest in building experience with Indigenous communities.
